Annual Green Fees

The treasurer's role is a voluntary one and we cannot guarantee when a cheque will be deposited in the bank. Please be aware that when writing a cheque that this is valid for 6 months and can be presented for payment within that 6 month period.

Foxes

This should be avoided as foxes are wild animals and should not be encouraged to rely on human's to provide their food source. It is fact that foxes will nest close to their food source so if you don't want the foxes nesting in your garden don't feed them!
