## Trees and landscaping

Over the last few years, the Committee has taken a proactive approach to maintaining the estate. The treasurer has given a lot of his time to review problem trees and other landscaping issues. As a result, the committee has recently commissioned a tree surgeon who will embark on a rolling programme to catalogue and trim and/or remove, where necessary, any problem trees.

This work should begin on  $19^{th}$  November and last about a week. This will ensure the estate is in a good condition for the next 2-3 years.

The committee are also looking into some planting of new shrubbery to give some colour in areas around the estate.



### **Dog Fouling**

There is a big problem with dog fouling on the estate and in private gardens. As there are no dog fouling bins on the estate owners are requested that they please clean up after their dogs.
