Green Fees Now Due

Green fees are now due for 2022/2023. Fees will be maintained at 2021/2022 level at **£90**. We are requesting that all residents use the  **Faster Payment** option via their internet banking again this year. Please see enclosed invoice for details. Green Fees should be paid no later than **Saturday 30th April 2022**.

 Last year, a number of residents did not make payment by the due date. It was necessary for our treasurer and other members of the committee to issue payment reminders and in some cases to 'chap doors'. As a reminder, our committee are a team of volunteers. Please be fair and pay on time.

What if I don't have access to Internet Banking?

For residents who do not have access to internet banking,

payments can be made easily at your own bank, or any Bank of Scotland - just take the invoice along with you to the bank.

What happens with your Green Fees?

The Association is responsible for maintaining the common green areas of the estate. The green fees that we each pay annually are primarily used to appoint an estate gardener. The gardener works throughout the year, cutting grass during the spring and summer months, clearing leaves in the autumn and winter and maintaining shrub beds and brushing paths throughout the year. Other contractors, such as tree surgeons, are appointed as necessary.

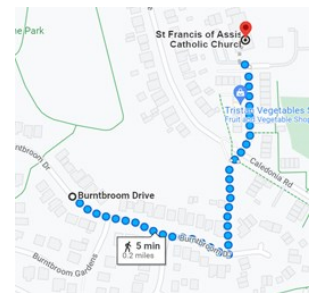
